

Scrapbooking Ideas

Supplies

1. Group like items together (general supplies, stickers, paper, etc.)
2. Share supplies with other scrapbookers – you don't need to own it all
3. Use acid free papers and storage tools that are made for scrapbooking
4. Store supplies in a dedicated space - makes easy to get to when you want to use them & easy to put away

Photos, etc. – items to put in your scrapbook

1. Set up homes to collect and store your photos and other items – boxes, files, envelopes
2. Sort items by event or scrapbook theme – wedding, graduation, baby shower, birthday, etc.
3. Label the boxes, files, etc. – makes it easy to add and for retrieval

Comments

1. Attend scrapbooking classes - this can be a great way to complete a scrapbooking project
2. Remember each scrapbook is only a snapshot of that moment in time
3. Enjoy yourself, it should be fun, not stressful.
